

## Isha L'Isha - Organizing KLAF archive

Isha L'Isha (woman to woman) Archive is a historical collection of the feminist movement in Israel for the last 40 years. This collection is unique and has no second in Israel. The archive includes rare materials of the feminist activities and is open to the public. The ultimate goal of my project in Isha L'Isha organization is to establish a digital archive that will bring together various collections from different past and present organizations that Isha L'Isha archive serves as a home to them, and allow free access, to their contents. As part of the efforts of the 'steering committee' of the archive to collect materials of feminist organizations that closed down. One of the closed organizations was KLAF - Lesbian feminist community that existed from 1987 until 2007. The organization's purpose was to create a safe and supportive place for lesbian, change attitudes and stereotypes toward the gay community and achieving equality in the legal level. In addition to promote original lesbian culture. Over the years they collected many materials about the community and its activities.

I chose to focus on this collection as a pilot of the digitizing of the various archival collections in Isha L'Isha. The workflow includes the organization and preparation of the physical materials before scanning on a basis of the filing key/ A subjects Key which is dividing the materials into administrative and activities of the organization. Then, we decided to establish a free, simple to operate, Web interface based on Google Drive, in line with the organization's budget capabilities. The final product will be a web "Link" to the online archive database. The link will be a part of the organization website.

In the future "Isha L'Isha" organization will continue to implement the filing key method on other collections that exist or will be donated, and allow access to everyone in accordance with the organization's ideology, which advocates accessibility of information for all.
